THE ADVOCACY GROUPS FEMNET, ECCHR, AND NGWF FILED THE <u>FIRST FORMAL COMPLAINT</u> INVOLVING LKSG IN APRIL 2023. THE COMPLAINT ALLEGES INTERNATIONAL CORPORATIONS SUCH AS AMAZON, IKEA, AND TOM TAILOR ARE VIOLATING THE LAW BY CONTINUING TO USE UNSAFE BANGLADESH FACTORIES.

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SUBSTANTIAL PENALTIES

LKSG ADDED TEETH TO GLOBAL HUMAN RIGHTS ENFORCEMENT THROUGH SUBSTANTIAL PENALTIES. VIOLATORS CAN BE FINED UP TO 2% OF THEIR ANNUAL GLOBAL REVENUES.
